In Butte County, an estimated 15.7% of residents identify as LGBTQ+, compared to 9.8% in California. Despite being a minority compared to the 84.3% who identify as straight or heterosexual, the LGBTQ+ community deserves equitable and respectful treatment. No matter who you love or how you identify, you matter, and everyone deserves to be acknowledged and supported in our diverse society.

According to the 2023 Butte County Community Health Assessment, it highlights significant concerns. Community members emphasized the need for more culturally appropriate resources for victims of violence. Additionally, there are alarming reports of LGBTQ+ youth facing bullying and hate crimes in schools, and homelessness leading to feelings of insecurity and hindering their ability to succeed and thrive, both mentally and physically.

"If someone comes out and they're not respected and loved by their family, then they're often rejected out onto the streets. So you have a significantly larger percentage of the homeless population that are LGBTQ+, especially in the youth"

"We rely quite heavily on Catalyst and Rape Crisis because we know that they want to be involved with us, and they care very much about [the LGBTQ+] community."

By acknowledging this historical legacy, we strengthen our commitment to ensuring that the history of the Black community is recognized and honored.


